George has spent much of his life in the fields of law and education. At the Catholic University of America (1978-2015), he held many positions including Professor of Law, Associate and Acting Dean of the Law School, and CUA's Vice Provost and Dean of Graduate Studies. He is currently an Emeritus Professor. A published scholar focusing on Catholic social teaching and economics, work and international development, he is also a member of the Scientific Committee (an academic advisory board) of the <u>Fondazione Centesimus Annus Pro Pontifice</u>, a Vatican foundation founded by St. Pope John Paul II.

Geri currently serves as a lector. In their former parish, she taught in the CCD program and served on multiple committees. She held administrative positions at the National Catholic Education Association, the U.S Conference of Catholic Bishops, the Irish Apostolate U.S.A, and is a Dame of the Pontifical Order of St. Sylvester, Pope and Martyr (the female equivalent of a Papal Knight). Together, while in Maryland, they participated in a small faith community in the parish, and co-chaired a special fund-raising effort in their parish for its part in an archdiocesan \$135 million Cardinal's Stewardship Capital Campaign.

George established, directed and participated in the "American Law" program for Polish students at the Jagiellonian University in Krakow, Poland. This effort involved annual trips to Poland to lead one-or-two-week courses taught in English, most often accompanied by Geri. As Associate Dean of the Law School, he also established summer law school programs for American law students in Krakow and in Rome, which was cosponsored by the Pontifical Lateran University.

We believe George and Geri serve as a model of Catholic family values for all.
